




Many of us want to help the poor, but it is increasingly difficult to identify those truly in need. Gift of Love is a program that was born from the work of Mongolia V.E.T. Net NGO which has been addressing the needs of rural Mongolians since 1995. Through our extensive network across the country, we are able to identify those in need and reach out a hand to them through a gift of sheep.

There are many desperate people across this vast country.. especially in small remote villages. A large number of them are widows and widowers trying to help raise children and grandchildren. They lack the safety net that we have in western countries.

This regal Mongolian Bankhar dog keeps the wolves away from the precious livestock of the Mongolian herder. Will you help V.E.T. Net keep the "wolves" away from the doors of these desperately poor Mongolian people? Your gift will go directly to buy sheep for these people to provide a sustainable source of food and fiber. There is no administrative cost since we implement this program through existing projects. There are small fees for getting money to Mongolia, but 100 % of what we receive goes directly to buy sheep for the needy. One sheep cost approximately \$100



VET Net receives a \$100 donation for the "Gift of Love". This donation is used to purchase 4 boxes of veterinary pharmaceuticals worth \$25 each.



VET Net now has 4 boxes of medicine for the "Gift of Love". VET Net keeps one of the boxes of medicine to sell. This provides cash to VET Net to help administer and implement the project.



Now there are 3 boxes left, however, these 3 boxes are still worth \$100 since the VET Net wholesale markup has been added to the value of each box.



The 3 boxes are now given to a rural veterinarian that has been trained by VET Net. This veterinarian will keep 1 of these boxes to sell. This leaves 2 boxes which now become worth \$100 because the veterinarian has added his profit margin.



The two boxes are now exchanged with a local herder for a sheep. Sheep are worth \$100. Herders often are without cash, trading sheep for medicine is a practical way to get the products he needs to protect the flock from disease.



The rural veterinarian along with VET Net personnel and community leaders will select needy people to receive the sheep. These are often widows or families with severe health problems.



The sheep is delivered to the recipient by VET Net and community leaders.



Although this example uses one sheep for illustration, we like to give four or five. This allows the recipient to use the males for food and keep the females to start a small flock.
